Non Sequitur ("It Does Not Follow")

This happens when one makes an argument, but the conclusion doesn't match the premise For example:

GF says to her BF: "I love to be in the of forest! I like the smell of the fallen le chipmunks running around eating acou wood with mushrooms...so nice!" BF:

(Boyfriend surprises girlfriend by graph bobcat excavator and dumping a ferror of dirt, old fallen leaves, logs, and scared chipmunks into her living rate for SOME reason, she doesn't appreciate to.
