

D16 Part IV: Hometown Tour Final Presentation Poster board

(100 pts; **Draft:** D19; **Final:** T2D20)

For the final presentation (**May 20th**), you'll be **creating a poster board** This is a **group assignment**. The assignment should be ready **for peer review in class D19**.

Make sure to **include** the following **sections / elements** with / on your poster board:

- **Intro:** Make sure it is **obvious** which community you are focusing on.
 - **Include** a nice **title**, that tells what **community** your tour describes, and who completed the assignment (group members)
 - **History:** share some basic facts about your community (2-3 ¶), such as:
 - A **synopsis** or **review** of the **town's history** from **beginnings** to **now**
 - **When** it was settled; where is it (include a **map** to show it today)
 - What **brought people** to the local **area**? (Why settle there?)
- **At least 3 Sites Mentioned** (borrowed from your **Part V Guided Tour** project) (2-3 ¶ each)
Each site should be from a **different category / section** (historic, natural, lodging, etc.) of your original Guided Tour assignment. Each should include:
 - **Information** that **ties** the **site** back to the **category** (explain why both the **category** and your **chosen site** are important / worth visiting)
 - **Share** some of the **cool info** you learned and included in your Guided Tour
 - Consider answering the **guiding questions** that visitors may have, etc.
 - **Or, add some new info** that you maybe **didn't include** in the Guided Tour!
- **Highlight** at least 1 **annual event** that the town hosts each year (2-3 ¶)
 - **What** is the event for? What does it **focus** on? Why is it **worth attending**?

Make sure to check the backside for all other details on grading. You will be presenting your project in class and in public, so be ready to speak for about 5 minutes or so about it, and answer any questions. Also, do not forget to **source your info** (put on the backside, or on a separate paper, etc.). Good luck! We'll present the drafts in class D19, and finally on D20.

Other Key Details to Remember:

- *Each section should have at least **one photo / illustration** & a **caption** explaining what it is*
- *Make sure to include a **map** showing where your **community** is located (people will ask!)*
- ***Cite all pictures / info** you use or borrow!*
- *Make sure to have **accurate facts!** (at least 10 for full points); cite where you got your info!*
- *Review the **rubric** on the back, and make sure to **follow it for full points!***
- *If you include **more sites, pictures, etc.** than required, you may get some **extra credit!***
